## Nicotine-laced bottled water hits drugstores

WESTLAKE VILLAGE, CA — Steve Reder, president of QT 5 Inc., a manufacturer of water laced with nicotine, has created NicoWater as a smoking substitute, the <u>Los Angeles Daily News</u> reported.

He told the paper that QT 5, which comes in a 16.9 fluid-ounce bottle, is filled with purified water and four milligrams of diluted nicotinum.

The company landed a contract with the Eckerd drug store chain, rolled-out the product in May and is now on sale in 2,600 stores. It's on the verge of entering Rite Aid, adding an additional 3,700 sites, and distributors are targeting bars and convenience stores, the article stated.

Reder said in the article that the bottles, sold with a suggested retail price of \$1.99, fend off the urge to smoke for 90 minutes or so.

## Health groups want nicotine-enhanced water regulated

WASHINGTON — Health groups and anti-tobacco organizations have filed petitions with the US Food and Drug Administration (FDA) to regulate cigarette alternatives, including a bottled water product containing nicotine called Nicotine Water.

The American Cancer Society, American Heart Association, American Legacy Foundation, American Lung Association, American Medical Association and the Campaign for Tobacco-Free Kids filed the petitions to the FDA, according to Reuters News Service.

The petition, Reuters reported, calls for the FDA to classify and regulate Nicotine Water as a drug or as a food containing a hazardous, unapproved food additive.

The FDA has for years sought to regulate tobacco and related products, but the US Supreme Court ruled last year that the agency has no authority to do so, Reuters said.

Nicotine Water, sold via the Internet by S.F. Garret at <u>the company</u> <u>website</u>, is available in a 16.9-ounce bottle, and the company claims it contains the nicotine equivalent of two cigarettes.

The company claims its products do not contain tar and does not produce smoke, both of which are blamed for many of the health-related problems caused by cigarettes, according to the site. However, company officials did not return phone calls from WaterTechOnnline.
