In the recent past you have read Splash NewsBulletins and Forum Q & A's that concern the severity of the "run off" problem...rains washing out pesticides, herbicides, fertilizers from residential, farm land, golf courses etc. Below is an interesting "tip of the week" we picked up on from one of our many trade journals demonstrating how each of us at our homes can help reduce the amount of run off and improve our own immediate environments.

Our Environmental Tip of the Week is courtesy of Mike Sieczkowski, Regenesis Bioremediation Products, Lenexa, Kan. "For those who want a less care-intensive but great-looking lawn, use a mulching blade on your lawn mover. If you can't mow as often as is required with a mulching blade (usually twice a week), change blades and mulch occasionally, especially in the peak growing season, mid to late spring. You will recycle the fertilizer (in the form of grass clippings) right back into your lawn instead of throwing it into the trash. The mulched grass clippings also promote moisture retention and discourage weed germination."
