Advocacy group: Water gets failing grade in three states

MADISON, WI — Wisconsin was one of three states to receive an "F" for its overall water policies and needs to pass laws to fully enforce the federal Clean Water Act, a Madison-based advocacy group said in a report cited by the <u>Green Bay</u> <u>Press-Gazette</u>.

Georgia and Michigan also received failing grades for their overall water policies. Florida, North Carolina, Ohio and Pennsylvania scored D's. Washington received a C, and New Jersey received a high B.

The study by the Wisconsin Public Interest Research Group said 40 percent of Wisconsin waters don't meet quality



standards of the act. Wisconsin flunked a review of its reporting, inspection, penalty assessment, mandatory penalties and public accountability policies and received a "C" in the maximum penalties category of the report, "Clean Water Enforcement Report Card: How Nine States' Regulations Measure Up."

Wisconsin does have a maximum penalty of \$10,000 per day and per violation, garnering a "C" grade in one category.

The advocacy group calls for more consistent inspections and reviews of facilities, timely enforcement actions and followups, heavier penalties that remove any economic incentive for polluting and stronger federal and state laws for enforcement, the paper reported.
